



**The painting** represents the amazingly coloured brood spiral in a hive of the native bee, and the intricate lacework around it. The blue circles above represents the stunning blue of the Australian sky / environment, while the patterns represent the native bee, it's wings and veins and body. The red and white dots represent the brood and individual bees, all interconnected in the pattern of life.

The circles down the side represent the native plants that attract the native bee.

De Greer-Yindimincarlie is the owner and operator of Yindi Artz - Authentic Aboriginal Creations. Yindi Artz has been operating on the Sunshine Coast for the last five years. De is an Aboriginal woman from the Wiradjuri Nation in Central Western New South Wales.
